A gentle reminder to please apply for the parent governor positions at Victoria Junior School. Your input will help us make Victoria Junior School a place we can be even prouder of.

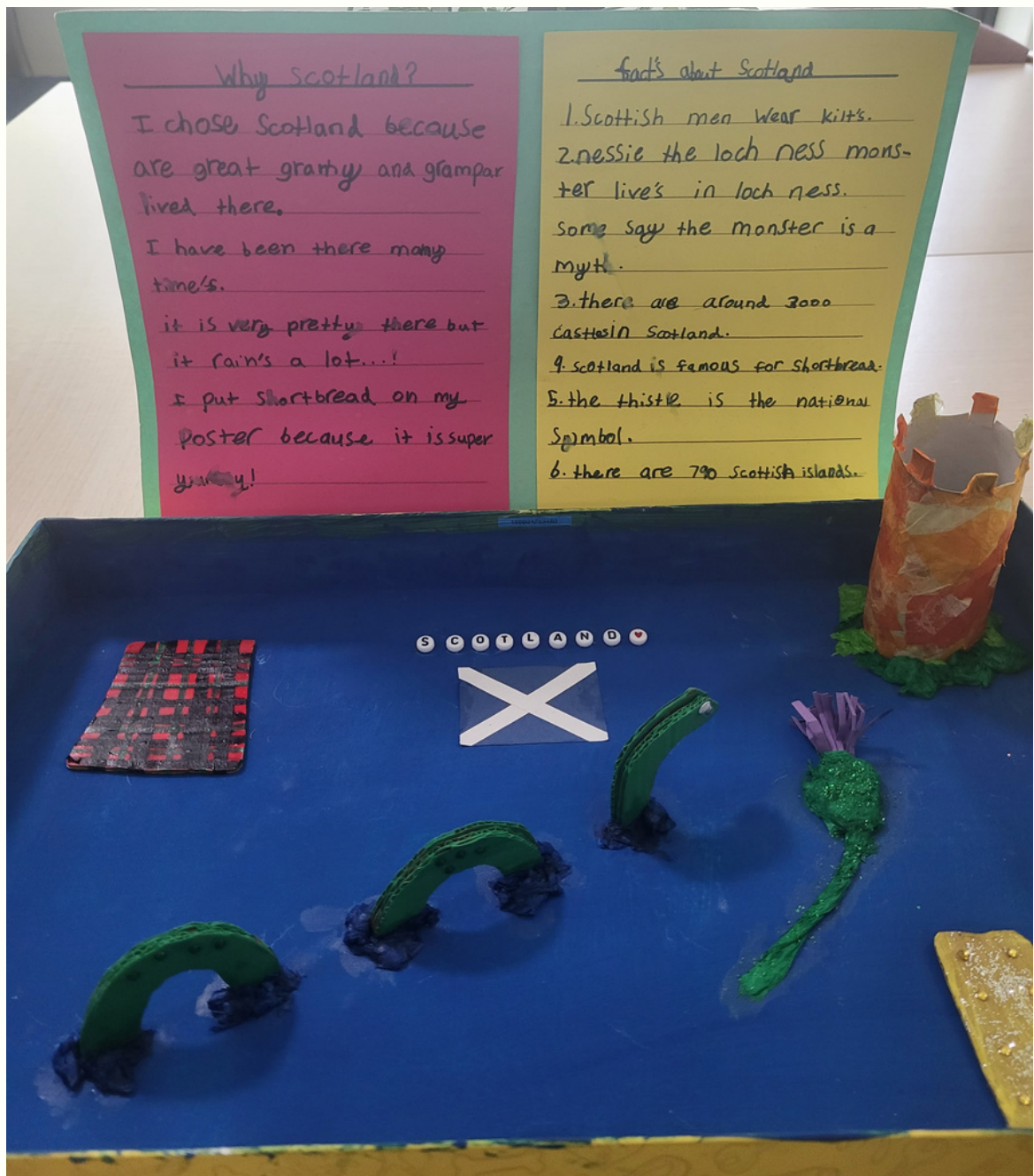
